NOTES ON COMPOSITION

1. ABOVE 150 WORDS – Mark the whole essay and award marks accordingly; But M/A must be limited to the 150 words only.
2. DEVIATION: Score zero (0) for the content and award marks for the other areas on 50% according to the scaling.
3. COPIED MATERIAL FROM QUESTION PAPER: Award (0) for the whole essay.
4. MORE THAN ONE ESSAY ATTEMPTED: Mark all, then select the best and cancel the rest *Rubric 2*
5. LETTER WRITING: Where a candidate writes down only the Address, award zero for the entire question.

NOTES ON COMPREHENSION, LEXIS AND STRUCTURE

1. Award 1 mark for every correct answer for Questions 2 and 3. *4*
2. Deduct ½ mark for 2 or more mistakes in an answer.
3. Deduct ½ mark for a one word answer wrongly spelt.

Points for Lawyer

- It is a prestigious occupation
- Earns more money
- The dress code
- They defend people
- They have longer service on the job/There is no limit
- They have the desire to help others

Points for Teacher

- Teaching is a respected Profession
- Teacher is resourceful
- They have regular income
- Teachers train all Professionals
- They have job security

NB: For any four (4) points raised and discussed well, award two (2) marks each (2 x 4 = 8 marks)

A good or subtle conclusion

CAUSES OF LORRY ACCIDENT

- i. Bad roads
- ii. Faulty vehicles
- iii. Bad road signs
- iv. Wrong overtaking
- v. Fatigue on the part of the drivers
- vi. Overloading
- vii. Lack of knowledge on road signs
- viii. Over speeding

SOLUTION

It should base on the causes given

- i. The roads should be maintained
- ii. The car owners should fix their cars
- iii. The Police should enforce the law
- iv. Education should be given to the drivers
- v. Offenders should be persecuted, etc.

NB: For every two (2) causes well discussed, award 2 marks (2x2=4)

NB: Award two (2) marks for reasons why he/she likes the person. (2 ~~marks~~)

CONCLUSION (1 Mark)

Any good/suitable conclusion
